## Late Work

The maximum grade for assignments handed in after the due date for any reason except absences is a 70 .

## Grading Policy

Your six weeks grade will be based on the following:

Tests - $45 \%$
Quizzes - 35\%
Daily/HW - 20\%

## Retake Policy

Students are eligible to retake any test or quiz for which they scored below a 70 .

There may be additional requirements in order to be eligible to retake such as attending tutoring, completing reteach assignment, or test corrections.

Retakes must be complete within a certain number of school days. The minimum number of days is 5 days but is often more.

During that time, the student must complete required reteach activities such as attending a tutorial or test corrections and complete the retake.

As always students are free to negotiate more time to complete a retake.

The highest grade a student can receive for a retest is a 70.

## Mobile Phone Policy

After reading about studies that strongly link cell phones in the classroom to a drop in grades, I've decided to require students to turn in their cell phones during class. Failure to follow this policy will result in me confiscating the student phone for the class or in some cases the day.

## FAQ's

Q: Can I throw this paper
out?
A: NO! You never know if you'll need that paper for a midterm exam or another assignment. At the end of a unit - take everything out of your binder and find a safe place to keep it at home until the end of the semester.

## Q: Do we have homework tonight?

A: YES! There are rare exceptions but in general homework is assigned in every class.

Q: What if I disagree with, or have a question about, one of my grades?
A: The BEST option is to chat with me in person, when we can BOTH look at an assignment and discuss it. If we don't have time to talk about it right then, we will agree on a time to meet. Many issues can be resolved by email as well. You are welcomed to send me a detailed email about the concern.
